## Mrs Marian Challoner

MARIAN Challoner, the proprietor of Shorwell Stores and Post Office for the past 32 years, has died suddenly, aged

Mrs Challoner was born in Walsall, West Midlands, and moved to the IW 32

years ago with her husband and son. After leaving school, she trained to become a dispensing chemist and worked for years at the local chemist, until the arrival of her son. Mrs Challoner had started dating

her husband, Cal, in 1958 and the pair married in 1960 at Pleck Methodist Church, Walsall. While in the West Midlands, Mrs

Challoner was involved in the Meth-odist church at Pleck, being Sunday school superintendent and running the girl guide group. Mrs Challoner was also the Division

Commissioner for the Bloxwich division of the girl guides.

Alongside this, she was a member of the Brownhills Co-Operative Choral Society and sang several times at the International Eisteddfod in Llangollen

In 1986, the family decided to move to the Island, having visited for many years.

The couple took over the Store and Post Office in Shorwell, while living in Carisbrooke.

She became involved in village life in every way, including joining the village Methodist chapel.

Mrs Challoner helped with the Sun-day school and became a key part of the ongoing worship at the chapel. In 1999, she became a Methodist local

preacher and for the past 19 years regularly led worship across the Island.

Mrs Challoner was heavily involved in the project to restore the bells in St Peter's Church, Shorwell, and was involved with the belfry band.

Mrs Challoner regularly raised money for a wide variety of charities, including the Freshwater Lifeboat, Mountbatten and recently the Children's Air Ambulance.

She spent many hours baking cakes for charity and people travelled across the Island to buy them. In September 2016, Mrs Challoner's

work for the Rotary Club's Shoebox Appeal was recognised when she was presented with The Rotary Paul Har-ris Fellowship Award along with her husband.

Mrs Challoner, with the help of the villagers, put together hundreds of shoeboxes that were sent off to children in need. She leaves her husband, son, David,

daughter-in-law, Kim, and grandchil-

dren, Jonathan and Benjamin. Her funeral will be at St Peter's Church, Shorwell, on Tuesday at 12.30pm and donations will be collected for Mountbatten and the Children's Air Ambulance.

## **New parking** zones coming

SIX new resident parking zones could be created each year on the Island. Residents could soon be able to apply for permit-only parking zones on their streets

A consultation into resident parking zones has been completed by the IW Council with 67 per cent agreeing with the scoring system for prioritising po-tential permit-only roads.

The policy has been recommended for approval by the IW Council cabinet and could see a dedicated staff member responsible for creating six zones a year, charging £60 for the first permit and £100 for the second car.

Under the new policy, residents would be able to apply for a parking zone if 80 per cent of kerbside space is occupied at peak times and if no more than 50 per cent of people on the street have a driveway or garage. Respondents to the survey said per-

mits should be restricted (56 per cent) to one per vehicle, with most feeling permits should be free, or under £50. Newport Parish Council stated a

preference for a zonal approach for all Newport residential streets within half a mile of St Thomas's Square, and a bespoke approach for Carisbrooke. The issue will be debated by the IW Council's scrutiny committee on September 11.

It will then go before the cabinet for approval on September 13.
